Standardized Testing

<u>PSAT - October of Junior Year</u>

Qualifying Exam for the National Merit Scholarship, National Achievement Scholarship and National Hispanic Recognition Program.

- These scholarships are awarded to students based upon PSAT scores by state (NY).
- Many colleges give merit based scholarships (as much as %2500) to students who earn these awards.
- Check your PSAT score and log on to <u>collegeboard</u> to identify your strengths and weaknesses.

Students typically take their first SAT and/or ACT in Junior Year.

Due to the pandemic many colleges became Test Optional for the class of 2021. Many may also be test optional for the class of 2022. TBD for the class of 2023.
